A warm welcome to St Luke's, whether it is your first time here or you are a regular worshipper. Everyone is very welcome to receive Communion or a blessing. Please follow the directions of the sidespeople. If it would be easier for you to receive Communion in your pew, please speak to one of the sidespeople. Gluten-free wafers (square in shape) are also available; please ask the priest when you receive Communion.

If you are new here, please introduce yourself to one of the sidespeople, identifiable by their name badges. They will be pleased to meet you and give you more information about our parish life. Please also stay behind after the service for refreshments.

Our main order of service is the coloured booklet. Hymn numbers can be seen on the front of this booklet and on the wooden board in church. The collect and readings can be read on the following pages of this booklet.

During term-time (except for the first Sunday of the month), children aged 3-11 are invited to leave the church for Sunday School after the Collect, returning during the distribution of Communion. Children in Year One and below should be accompanied by one parent.

There is an unsupervised creche for children aged 0-2 in the vestry, with a video livestream of the service. Please speak to the sidespeople for details of how to access this room.

There is an induction loop system in the church for those who are hard of hearing. Hearing aids should be moved to the "T" position.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

When Peter saw it, he addressed the people, 'You Israelites, why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we had made him walk? The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our ancestors has glorified his servant Jesus, whom you handed over and rejected in the presence of Pilate, though he had decided to release him. But you rejected the Holy and Righteous One and asked to have a murderer given to you, and you killed the Author of life, whom God raised from the dead. To this we are witnesses. And by faith in his name, his name itself has made this man strong, whom you see and know; and the faith that is through Jesus has given him this perfect health in the presence of all of you. 'And now, friends, I know that you acted in ignorance, as did also your rulers. In this way God fulfilled what he had foretold through all the prophets, that his Messiah would suffer. Repent therefore, and turn to God so that your sins may be wiped out.

A reading from the first letter of John.

See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is. And all who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure. Everyone who commits sin is guilty of lawlessness; sin is lawlessness. You know that he was revealed to take away sins, and in him there is no sin. No one who abides in him sins; no one who sins has either seen him or known him. Little children, let no one deceive you. Everyone who does what is right is righteous, just as he is righteous.

Gospel Reading: Luke 24.36b-48

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. Glory to you, O Lord.

While they were talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you.'They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. He said to them, 'Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have.' And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' They gave him a piece of broiled fish, and he took it and ate in their presence. Then he said to them, 'These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you-that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled.' Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, 'Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things.

Electoral Roll Is Open For Revision

Please check to see if your name is on our parish's Electoral Roll, which is posted at the back of the church. If your name is not listed, please fill in the form provided and post it in the box or return it to the Parish Office. The clergy will be glad to help if you have questions.

Thank you to those who have already filled in new forms; your names will be added when we revise the list. The new roll will be in both churches from Sunday 28 April for you to check your entry. At that time, amendments can be made but no new names can be added until after the Annual Parochial Church Meeting, which will take place on Wednesday 15 May in St Luke's Hall at 7.00pm. Details about the meeting will be sent shortly. You are warmly invited to attend the APCM and being on the roll entitles you to vote on any of the issues that may come up.

What is the Electoral Roll? Every church in the Church of England has a list or "Electoral Roll" of all the people who have been baptised, are aged 16 or over, and who either live in the parish or have been attending the church for more than six months. (It is not connected with the national Electoral Register, although the name sometimes causes confusion!)

How does it help to be on the list? The total number of people on the Electoral Roll is sent to the Diocese of London, which is in overall charge of church finances and governance for this area. The size of our parish (measured by the Electoral Roll) can affect how many clergy are sent to work here, the number of representatives we can have on wider church bodies, and some fundraising applications.

Do I need to do anything else? Being on the roll does not involve any further commitment from you, or any obligations. But it does count for us, and also means we have clearer records and are better able to assess which areas of the church are growing and which need more work.
